Educational Evaluation in Brazil: the Challenge of Assuring Quality

Thirty years ago, the Brazilian Federal Constitution of 1988, through its article 206, item VII, inserted in the public agenda the commitment to a "assurance of a quality standard" as a principle for education in Brazil, thereby consolidating an advancement in a fundamental social right. In this context, educational evaluation, in its multiple dimensions, is characterized as a key tool for monitoring and analyzing educational processes, enabling its improvement and the consequent search for quality in teaching.

The Brazilian Association of Educational Evaluation (ABAVE), founded in 2003, has become a forum for discussion among researchers and professionals who dedicate themselves to the development of research and proposals for educational evaluation and are committed to the improvement of education in the country. The topics discussed in several of the past meetings organized by the Association have been in dialogue with the constitutional principle of the right to quality education.

However, 30 years after the promulgation of the Constitution, considering the advances and limits of the proposed public policies aimed at the improvement of education at its various levels, there is a need to re-dimension the challenge of quality.

In its 10th meeting, the proposed theme "Educational Evaluation in Brazil: the challenge of quality", aims to update the debate in Basic and Higher Education, focusing on three thematic axes: the relations between curriculum and evaluation, through the debates centered around the implications of the recently approved National Curriculum Guideline (BNCC) for large scale evaluations; the quality of professional education; and, lastly, the challenges to the quality in Brazilian Higher Education. In addition to the conferences, the 10th ABAVE Meeting will have in its program short courses, round table discussions, and oral presentations, enabling the scientific divulgation and the exchange of experience and information between researchers,







professors, and students from different fields of knowledge, interested in educational evaluation.

We invite all those interested in the challenges faced in the search for educational quality to participate in the 10th ABAVE Meeting, to be held in São Paulo, from the 28th to the 30th of August, 2019 in the Convention Center of the American Chamber of Commerce (AMCHAM).

Further information on the 10th meeting will be published soon on ABAVE's website.
